CYS OPENS 72nd SEASON WITH WORLD PREMIERE

CYS Joins The California Festival: A Celebration of New Music Sunday, November 5 @ 2:30 PM

The California Youth Symphony, under the direction of Maestro Leo Eylar, kicks off its 72nd season with a dazzling program featuring the award-winning and internationally recognized Senior Orchestra. We are both honored and delighted to present a world premiere by noted Argentinian composer Valeria Pelka. Commissioned by the California Youth Symphony, *Memorias Argentinas* is a three-movement work inspired by the African roots of Argentinian folk music: in particular, the *chacarera*, *zamba*, and *malambo*. This highly evocative and energetic orchestral tour de force showcases all sections of the orchestra and is sure to please. As a special treat, the composer herself will be in attendance to introduce the composition to the audience!

CYS is honored to be participating in the California Festival, which will take place November 3–19 and will bring together organizations and ensembles from throughout California, including symphony orchestras, chamber music groups, jazz ensembles, choirs and more, all performing new music as part of their broader season programs.

CYS also welcomes our Young Artist Competition winner Rin Homma, who will perform Ravel's jazz-inspired Piano Concerto in G Major. Our season opener will also feature music by Manuel de Falla as well as the stirring Symphony No. 1 by Jean Sibelius. Performs Ravel's Piano Concerto in G Major

Eighteen-year-old Rin Homma is a former scholarship student at the Colburn Conservatory in Los Angeles. Since performing at the San Diego Salute to Champions at age six, Rin has participated in several competitions, winning first place in the MTAC Piano Regional Competition five consecutive times, three of which took her to the state finals. In 2018, she appeared with the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra in a three-day tour featuring Beethoven's Piano Concerto No. 1. She also garnered second place in the MTNA (Music Teachers National Association) California Junior

Competition and emerged as a finalist in the 2020 SJIPC (San Jose International Piano Competition). She recently placed second in the 2023 Edith Knox Concerto Competition and first in the 2023 Pasadena Alumnae Chapter of Sigma Alpha lota Scholarship Competition. Previously a student of Mina Perry, Hans Boepple, and Frank Lévy, she is currently a second-year student of Professor Inna Faliks at UCLA.

CYS HOLIDAY CONCERTS

The California Youth Symphony will present its annual Holiday Concerts on December 3 (San Mateo Performing Arts Center) and December 10 (Foothill College). On Sunday, December 3, at 2:30 PM, the CYS

Wind Symphony and Wind Ensembles, under the direction of Pete Nowlen and newly appointed Wind Ensembles Director Anthony Lanzino, will feature music by Bernstein, Holst, Williams, Oliver and others. The following Sunday, December 10, at 2:30 PM, the CYS String Ensembles, under the direction of Kati Kyme, and CYS Associate and Senior Orchestras, conducted by Leo Eylar, will present the annual Holiday Concert in the Smithwick Theatre on the campus of Foothill College in Los Altos Hills. Once again the orchestras will offer the audience a pleasing mix of classical and holiday favorites and will welcome Senior Orchestra flutist Eric Miao, who will perform Carl Reinecke's Flute Concerto in D Major. Admission is free, but advanced ticket reservations are recommended.


Eric Miao, 16, winner of the 2022-23 CYS Associate Orchestra concerto competition, will perform the first movement of Carl Reinecke's Flute Concerto at the Holiday Concert on Sunday, December 10 at 2:30 PM at the Foothill College Smithwick Theatre. Eric began playing the flute at the age of 11 and private lessons at age 13 with Yingying Wang. He is currently studying with SCU and SJSU professor Ray Furuta, and has played in masterclasses with Jill Felber and Isabelle Chapuis. He is a junior at Saratoga High School and participates in the school music program under the excellent direction of Jason Shiuan and Michael Boitz. He is a two-year member of the Santa Clara County Honor Band, as well as the first-place winner of the 2022 American Protégé competition and Saratoga High School concerto competition.

CALIFORNIA YOUTH SYMPHONY **SPAIN TOUR 2024**

In June of 2024, the California Youth Symphony Senior Orchestra will embark on a 12-day tour of Spain, with performances in Madrid, Valencia, Granada, and Seville. The concerts will include such works as Stravinsky's Firebird Suite, Gershwin's American in Paris, Pelka's Memorias Argentinas, de Falla's Three-Cornered Hat, as well as music by noted Japanese film composer Joe Hisaishi. The musicians will have a full itinerary, which includes visits to the world-famous Prado Museum, El Escorial, the Alhambra of Granada, and other cultural landmarks rich in both Spanish and Moorish history. A highlight will be a performance at the International Festival of Music in Granada. Maestro Eylar is excited to re-visit Spain with CYS, as it has been 26 years since our last tour in this remarkable country!
