

Each spring, the California Youth Symphony holds its Young Artist Competition to select soloists for the following season. This year's Competition will be held at San Francisco Conservatory of Music, in the Cha Chi Ming Recital Hall, on Saturday, March 23, 2024. The Competition is open to all young pianists and instrumental soloists under the age of 19. Two young artists will be chosen by a panel of three judges to perform with the CYS Orchestra during the November or March concert series of the 2024-25 season. A monetary award will also be presented to the winners. Application deadline is March 3, 2024. There is a non-refundable fee of \$75. SPRING FESTIVAL CONCERTS

The California Youth Symphony is pleased to continue our popular March Festival Concert series with two concerts on March 3rd. At 1pm, under the direction of Maestra Kati Kyme, our Virtuosi Strings will perform works by C.P.E. Bach and Dvôrák. Maestro Anthony Lanzino, our new Director of Wind Ensembles, will lead the Chamber Winds in works by Dvôrák, Krumenauer, and Saucedo; and the Wind Ensemble in Ellerby's Paris Sketches. Then, for the 6pm concert, Maestros Nowlen and Eylar have prepared a scintillating and diverse program that is sure to please. The Wind Symphony continues its far-reaching programming with Brian Balmages's Industrial Loops, Viet Cuong's Rule of Three, and Yukiko Nishimura's Star Ship. Maestro Eylar will conduct the Associate Orchestra in a distinctly Spanish/Latin American program, featuring works by Alberto Ginastera and Gerardo Gardelin. We will also introduce our Associate Orchestra 2023-24 Concerto Competition winners Madelyn Zhu, violin, and Evelyn Wu, flute, performing Lalo's Symphonie espagnole and Griffes's Poem, respectively. SPRING CONCERT-SENIOR ORCHESTRA

Our Senior Orchestra Spring Concert on March 24th at 2:30pm features ground-breaking music by Sri Lankan/Canadian composer Dinuk Wijeratne, a conductor, composer, pianist, professor, and polymath. He completed his virtuoso orchestral showpiece *Polyphonic Lively* in 2016, which was rapturously received upon its world premiere. Regarding the piece, the composer has written: "Its musical fabric is a multiplicity of voices, lines, and themes that decide — on a whim — when to coalesce and coexist." In addition, we are delighted to welcome violinist Dustin Breshears, winner of the CYS Young Artist Competition, who will perform Jean Sibelius's thrilling Violin Concerto in D minor. Filled with passion, tenderness, and folk-like exuberance, it remains at the apex of violin repertoire. Our program closes with music from the first of the three epochmaking (and -breaking) ballets composed by Igor Stravinsky for Serge Diaghilev's Ballets Russes: *The Firebird*. The version we are performing is a powerhouse tour-de-force for orchestra which takes us through the story in a tableaux of six movements, closing with the magnificent Finale that ends the original ballet. DUSTIN BRESHEARS violin

Dustin Breshears, age 16, is a violinist and violist studying at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music, Precollege Division. He studies violin with Nancy Zhou and viola with Jonathan Vinocour. Dustin has soloed with eight different orchestras since the age of six. He has won numerous solo awards, including winner Parnassus-San Francisco Conservatory of Music Concerto Competition, 1st Place MTAC State VOCE Competition, winner Palo Alto Philharmonic Concerto Movement Competition, 1st Place Bay Philharmonic Young Artist Competition, 1st Place Mary Jane Beck Young Artist Competition (Nova Vista Symphony), 1st place California Youth Symphony Young Artist Competition, 1st Place U.S. International Music Competition, 1st Place U.S. Open Music Competition,

1st Place ASTA-San Francisco Competition, 1st Place ASTA-Sacramento Competition, 1st Place CAPMT-Sacramento Competition, 1st Place DVC-HNU Strings Competition, 1st Place Classical Masters Competition, and a winner of the 2021 Pacific Musical Society & Foundation Competition. Dustin is a recipient of the 2021 Jack Kent Cooke Young Artist Award.



EVELYN WU flute

Evelyn Wu, age 17, started playing the flute at the age of 9. She has studied privately for 7 years, including the past 4 years with Professor Michelle Caimotto, a flutist in the San Francisco Ballet Orchestra. Evelyn is currently a senior at Dougherty Valley High School, where she is a member of their wind ensemble. In 2022, she received the Certificate of Merit State Honors Award at the Advanced Level. She has previously been a member of the Contra Costa County Honor Band, and she was selected as first flute to the 2023 NCBA All-Northern Honor Band and California All-State Concert Band ensembles.



MADELYN ZHU violin

Madelyn Zhu, age 11, is from Palo Alto. She started her first violin lesson at age five-and-a-half and currently studies with Zhao Wei. Madelyn has won several violin awards, including 1st place in the U.S. International Music Competition (USIMC) in 2021 and 2023, and 2nd place in the Pacific Musical Society & Foundation Competition in 2023. She has also attended the Summer Music Institute at Tateuchi Hall. This is her first year in CYS.
