## SAN FRANCISCO SYMPHONY YOUTH ORCHESTRA JOINS FIVE OTHER ORCHESTRAS IN BAY AREA YOUTH ORCHESTRA FESTIVAL SUNDAY, JANUARY 15 IN DAVIES SYMPHONY HALL

## California Youth Symphony, El Camino Youth Symphony, Marin Symphony Youth Orchestra, Oakland Youth Orchestra, and Young People's Symphony Orchestra also perform in benefit for Bay Area homeless and underserved youth

**SAN FRANCISCO, December 14** — The San Francisco Symphony presents the Bay Area Youth Orchestra Festival on Sunday, January 15 at 3:00 p.m. at Davies Symphony Hall, bringing together over 500 young musicians from throughout the Bay Area to perform on one stage. This year's participants are the <u>California Youth Symphony</u> and <u>El Camino Youth Symphony</u>, both from Palo Alto; the <u>Marin Symphony Youth Orchestra</u>; the <u>Oakland Youth Orchestra</u>; the <u>San Francisco</u> <u>Symphony Youth Orchestra</u>; and the <u>Young People's Symphony Orchestra</u> from Berkeley. Proceeds from the concert benefit six organizations, one within each orchestra's local community, that provide resources to underserved and homeless youth. Following the tremendous success of the 2009 and 2011 festivals, the SFS will present the Bay Area Youth Orchestra Festival on a biannual basis.

Proceeds from the concert will benefit Bay Area homeless youth organizations including <u>Sunday Friends</u> in San Jose; <u>InnVision</u> in the South Bay and Peninsula; <u>Homeward Bound</u> in Marin County; <u>Covenant</u> <u>House</u> of Oakland; <u>Students Rising Above</u> in San Francisco; and <u>YEAH</u>! in Berkeley.

The works to be performed are Rimsky-Korsakov's *Capriccio espagnol*, by the Young People's Symphony Orchestra; Borodin's *Polovtsian Dances*, Part 2, by El Camino Youth Symphony; the fourth movement of Dvořák's Symphony No. 9, by the Marin Symphony Youth Orchestra; Ravel's *La Valse*, by the California Youth Symphony; Saint-Saëns's *Danse Bacchanale* from *Samson and Delilah*, by the Oakland Youth Orchestra; and the first and second movements of Prokofiev's Symphony No. 5, by the San Francisco Symphony Youth Orchestra. To conclude the concert, musicians representing each orchestra will join the SFSYO onstage for a combined performance of Prokofiev's "Death of Tybalt" from *Romeo and Juliet*.
