Happy 70th, CYS!

elcome to CYS's 70th Anniversary season, the return of in-person rehearsals, and our first live concert in well over a year and a half. A return to live performances is a homecoming for our community, a return to the excitement of live music for our audiences, and the return of our students performing the most advanced orchestral repertoire alongside exciting new works by living composers.

I am especially honored to be joining the California Youth Symphony as its next Executive Director during this exciting time for the orchestra. With the Senior Orchestra having freshly finished a wildly successful (and safe!) camp, and in-person rehearsals having resumed, we truly have many reasons to celebrate.

Maestro Eylar and I would love to invite you to join us for our Homecoming on October 31st, which sees the California Youth Symphony Senior Senior Orchestra taking the stage at the San Mateo Performing Arts Center with our Young Artist Competition winner Emily Hwang performing the Stamitz Viola Concerto in D major.

In addition to the Stamitz. the orchestra will perform two of the most exciting pieces in the orchestral repertoire: Berlioz's Roman Carnival Overture, and Ravel's massive opus, Daphnis et Chloé Suites 1 and 2. The two suites are rarely performed together, even among the world's top professional orchestras, so it's a rare treat to see such a massive work performed by our premiere ensemble. Having heard a part of the Senior Orchestra's rehearsal on the Ravel. I was entranced by the orchestra's lush and warm sound and I can't wait to hear them in a proper concert hall!

I am personally also looking forward to CYS's Holiday offerings on December 5th with violinist David Wang and bassoonist Sonny Young as the Senior Orchestra's soloists and watching my first performance of the Associate



Orchestra, Maestro Nowlen's Wind Symphony, Maestra Kyme's String Ensembles & Maestra Amador's Wind Ensembles.

Hungary, Poland and the Czech Republic Tour

Capping our 70th Anniversary season will be CYS's highly anticipated return to international touring. Our 2022 tour will take the orchestra to Eastern Europe for four performances in the historically and culturally fascinating countries of Hungary, Poland, and the Czech Republic.

Starting in the Czech Republic, CYS will make its return to Prague for the first time since 2014. In addition to our performance at the famous Dvořák Hall of the Rudolfinum, home of the Czech Philharmonic Orchestra, CYS musicians will tour the city's Castle and Malá Strana neighborhood, the beautiful Saint Nicholas Square, and enjoy a river cruise River Cruise along the beautiful VItava River.

CYS will make its Polish debut with concerts in Wroclaw and Krakow. The orchestra will perform at the Karol Lipiński Academy of Music in Wroclaw - an important university and cultural center of the Lower Silesia region. The group will visit significant cultural sites that range from ancient architecture up through the 20th century.

CYS concludes its two-week adventure in Hungary, performing in one of Budapest's magical venues, along with sightseeing, plenty of free time, and a farewell folklore dinner.

Join us at our Tour Preview Concert *Bon Voyage* on Sunday, June 19 at 2:30PM at the San Mateo Performing Arts Center and wish Maestro Eylar and the orchestra Bon Voyage as they prepare to embark on their Central European odyssey, marking 23 international tours in 26 countries on 5 continents across the world.

Violin

CYS Senior Orchestra violinist David Wang, age 13, will perform the Finale of Max Bruch's Violin Concerto No. 1 at the Holiday Concert on December 5th at the San Mateo Performing Arts Center. David resides in San Jose, California, and is a student of Pat Burnham. He began his violin studies at the age of six. David enjoys reading literature and talking to friends and colleagues.



EMILY HWANG Viola

The California Youth Symphony is excited to feature Young Artist Competition winner Emily Hwang, who will perform the Viola Concerto in D Major by Carl Stamitz at the Season Opener concert on October 31st. Emily, 16, is a junior at Gunn High School. She began playing viola at the age of 8 under Sujung Seok, and currently studies with Dimitri Murrath at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music Pre-College Division.

Emily was the California winner of the 2019 MTNA State Competition in the Junior Strings category, and was named alternate winner of the 2020 MTNA National Competition, Southwest division. She received 2nd place at the 2021 Houston International Music Competition, the 2020 ENKOR International Strings Competition, and the 2021 ASTA San Francisco Solo Competition, and has also been chosen to perform on NPR's "From the Top" radio show. As a



soloist, Emily performed with the Palo Alto Chamber Orchestra in 2017, and was given the opportunity to play with the San Francisco Chamber Orchestra at their 2018 Gala Concert.

She participated in the 2019 Music@Menlo Young Performers program, and in the 2020 and 2021 Morningside Music Bridge Festivals, where she had the opportunity to work with violists Steve Tenenbom, Kim Kashkashian, Hsin-yun Huang, Teng Li, Yu Jin, Atar Arad, and Paul Coletti. She has also performed for violists Nobuko Imai, Yura Lee, and Ayane Kozasa. Besides playing the viola, Emily enjoys writing, ballet, and spending time with her family and friends.

SONNY YOUNG

Bassoon

CYS alumnus Sonny Young, age 19, will perform the first movement of Gioachino Rossini's Bassoon Concerto at the Holiday Concert on December 5th at the San Mateo Performing Arts Center. He studied bassoon with Yueh Chou, and played in CYS from 2018-2020, where he served as the principal bassoonist in the Associate Orchestra for one year and the Senior Orchestra for two years. During his time at Palo Alto High School, he played as the first bassoon in the school's Concert Band, Symphonic Band, and Wind Symphony, conducted the school's pep band, and performed as a guest bassoonist at San Jose State University's Beethoven 7th Symphony concert. He also participated in the Santa Clara



County Honor Band as the first bassoon and the California All State Honor Ensembles in 2018, 2019, and 2020, with his final year as the first bassoon in the High School Symphony Orchestra. During his gap year in 2021, he played bassoon in the virtual Yale Symphony Orchestra and later served as the principal bassoon in the Stanford Summer Symphony. Sonny is currently a student at Stanford University studying chemistry.

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RETURN TO LIVE MUSIC WITH CONFIDENCE

We are pleased to invite you to join us back in the concert hall to experience the magic of live music once again in a physically distanced setting. In alignment with the Santa Clara & San Mateo County Health's guidelines, CYS has implemented the following policies and procedures to provide a safe environment for our audiences, artists, and staff:

VACCINATION POLICY

Starting in October, proof of full vaccination will be required for everyone attending CYS concerts. "Fully vaccinated" means 2 weeks after your second dose in a 2-dose series or after a single-dose vaccine. California residents may request a digital vaccination record at MyVaccineRecord.cdph.ca.gov. All attendees will need to bring either their physical vaccination card, a picture of their vaccination card, or a digital vaccination record, along with their valid photo ID and concert ticket.

MASK MANDATE

Wear a mask with two or more layers. Wear the mask over your nose and mouth and under your chin. The following are prohibited: Masks with exhalation valves; masks made of loosely woven fabrics; scarves, buffs, bandanas, gaiters, and face shields alone (inadequate protection). The performers on stage will be masked, so we ask that you are too!

STAY AT HOME IF YOU ARE ILL

Stay home if you are sick or have COVID-19 symptoms, have been in contact with someone known to be or suspected to have been infected with COVID-19 within the last 10 days, or if you are subject to a quarantine or isolation order. For ticket returns, please email Info@cys.org.

ENHANCED HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES

The San Mateo Performing Arts Center runs its ventilation system at all times, regardless of weather conditions, to make sure the air is exchanging as frequently as possible. Hand sanitizer stations are positioned throughout the hall. Please wash your hands with soap and water for 20 seconds or use the hand sanitizer stations. Digital tickets are able to be scanned and program books will be available in both printed and digital formats. CYS will also implement physical distancing.

CYS LIVE STREAM

For the first time in CYS history, we will live stream our concerts on October 31st and December 5th on the CYS YouTube channel. Guests who are not fully vaccinated or not yet eligible for vaccination are able to view our live performances from the safety of their own homes.
